Description			
Provide a short description of the event and its activities.			
<p>At the event, we recovered the story of three women who have contributed to shaping the democracy conquered after the years of Franco's dictatorship: Paca Sauquillo, Carmen Díes de Rivera, and Dulcinea Bellido. Their biographies were presented by three experts who either had a close relationship with the protagonists or had previously conducted researches about their biographies :</p>			

Carmen Barrios Corredera presented the biography of Dulcinea Bellido. Carmen is a journalist and writer of the saga “Rojas; Stories born from the testimony of the protagonists of Silenced History”, which includes the story of Dulcinea Bellido.

Eva García Sempere presented the biography of Carmen Díez de Rivera. Eva is a Biologist, collaborator of “Mundo Obrero”, in charge of the monthly column, “Science for the people”; biographical sketches of different people who have contributed to science with a more social and democratic perspective. Eva is also in charge of the biographies of Dulcinea Bellido, Carmen Díez and Paca Sauquillo for the Mothers of EU project.

Ignacio López Cano presented the Biography of Paca Sauquillo. Ignacio has a law degree, he is Deputy in Congress for Málaga and was a founding member of the MPDL-Málaga founded and chaired by Paca Sauquillo..

This panel was moderated by Antonia Morillas Former director of the Women's Institute in Spain, and presented by Andrés Falck, Director of Coglobal.

This event was attended by representatives of social entities, university professors, activists for feminism and participatory democracy, etc.

Following the presentations, a group discussion was initiated with all participants, focusing on the role of women in building democracy in Spain.

One of the main conclusions was that the three women presented, played a key role in society and in the institutions to advance political and civil rights, and that they paid with persecution, losses and even prison for the audacity of assuming that role.

Likewise, it was reviewed how the narratives of the Spanish transition – and those of history in general – have been constructed from a male perspective, frequently making women's contributions invisible. Therefore, activities such as the Opening Event make it possible to repair this mistake and make visible the struggle of women and their valuable contribution to the construction of democracy in Spain, especially with the younger population.
